The Art Centres involved include Babbarra Designs and Injalak Arts from Arnhem Land, NT, Merrapen Arts from Daly River, NT and Nagula Jarndu from Broome WA. All fabrics have been bought directly from the art centres to ensure that profits are returned directly to the art centres and the artists.
